Comparative Strucural Mapping of Highlands on Venus and Cratons on Earth

Lauren is a first year graduate student in the Department of Earth, Environmental, and Planetary Sciences at Washington University in St. Louis. Her current research uses remotely sensed data, including multispectral imagery and synthetic aperture radar, to map geological structures on Earth and other rocky bodies in the Solar System. Lauren's research aims to better our understanding of the tectonic evolution of rocky planets and how tectonics impacts climate and habitability.

<u>Assimilation and Immiscibility: Possible Mechanisms for the Formation of Iron-Oxide-Apatite (IOA)</u>
<u>Deposits</u>



Will Hunt

Will Hunt is a Ph.D. student at the University of Missouri-Columbia where he studies the interaction between fluids and rocks, particularly in ore deposits using microthermometry and experimental petrology. I have experience in other areas including using UAVs to collect LiDAR data and images used for 3D modelling, seismic line surveys, and GIS.

In this talk, I want to cover what IOA deposits are, their impact on the search for critical minerals, and a recently proposed mechanism for the formation of IOA deposits, in which silicate magmas may be intruding into evaporite-bearing sedimentary layers, which are then assimilated, producing immiscible silicate-rich and iron-rich melts. I will also share some of my current work in which I am looking for evidence of this interaction in the Shepherd Mountain and Pilot Knob deposits in southeast Missouri as well as some experimental work in which I hope to confirm the validity of this proposed mechanism.

Wednesday, November 5th, 2025 @ River City Casino, Saint Louis, Missouri. The St. Louis Chapters of the Geo-Institute (GI) and Structural Engineers Institute (SEI) are now accepting abstracts for the 14th Annual Structural and Geo-Confluence. The conference will be a multi-track, full-day event featuring technical topics and case histories presented by local and national experts. The joint morning session will focus on topics concerning the confluence of geotechnical and structural engineering. There will be two tracks in the afternoon: one track on geotechnical engineering and geo-environmental topics, and one track on structural engineering topics. The conference is open to all engineering and construction professionals and students.

The planning committee is seeking speakers to provide a 35- to 50-minute presentation focused on structural engineering, geotechnical engineering, or geo-environmental topics with specific preference given to topics that overlap these focus areas. All persons are encouraged to submit an abstract to Patrick Kinsella at pat.kinsella@shanwil.com by July 24, 2025. Abstracts should be limited to 250 words. Once the planning committee has reviewed the abstracts, notification will be provided to the selected presenters by mid-August 2025. The submitted abstracts and presentation slides will be assembled and included in the conference publication.
